From the Pastor's Desk...

Last summer I preached a sermon series from the book of Esther called "Now is the Time." While I was preaching that series, I challenged the congregation to ask God what tasks or objectives were we being led to accomplish for God's name's sake.

Among the various things that people heard God leading us to do were to start a group for children (the Jesus Club), open a food closet (it should be opened this month), work with the homeless (Family Promise will be making a presentation during the Lenten breakfasts) and to help the people in Joplin, MO. We decided we don't just want to think about doing things for God, we want to actually do things for God, so all of these plans have been put into motion.

Perhaps the scariest and largest of these steps of faith is the trip to Joplin, MO. This month, on February 19, Marshallton UMC will be taking a team of six people to Joplin to help those who lost their homes or otherwise had their lives disrupted by the tornado that ravaged the town. We are excited about the opportunity to show the love of Christ that dwells in the people of Marshallton UMC to those in need in Joplin.

We know that not everyone can make this trip, but we do hope that each person in our congregation can share in the trip by prayer and support. The estimated cost of the trip is \$800 per person which in this economic climate can be quite a strain, so we are inviting those who wish to support the trip to donate to help defray the cost. Thus far we have gathered about ¼ of the money we need and with only three weeks before we leave, it is important we complete the fundraising soon.

If you should choose to join in this trip without traveling, you can become a shareholder by purchasing a share for \$100. (Smaller amounts are also welcome.) This will enable you to fully become invested as part of the team, and entitle you to come to the shareholders dinner that will be held upon our return. This is when we will show pictures, share stories and give testimonies of the lives that have been affected.

It is curious that we are going the week that Lent begins. In a way, what we are giving up for Lent is a bit of normalcy so that others can gain a bit of the same. I think this is a good way to realize what Lent is all about, sacrificing on behalf of others.

Coincidentally, during the month of February we will be hearing sermons about giving to God. As we hear what God desires, our response will be cheerful and fulfilling. Then, as Lent starts we will focus on developing the fruit of the spirit. Let this be your spiritual pursuit as we approach Easter, recognizing what Jesus gave and the spirit that dwells in our hearts.

Be sure to do your part. As you prepare for Lent, and prepare for easter, consider what you will give to God. It just may be that God wants you to give to those in Joplin, MO as well. Contact the office if you are being led to be a shareholder and together we will see what God can do as we step out in faith.

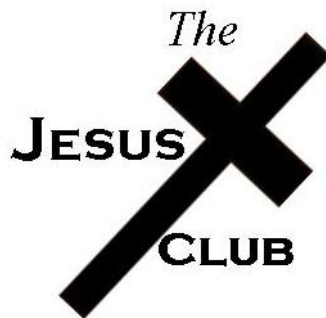

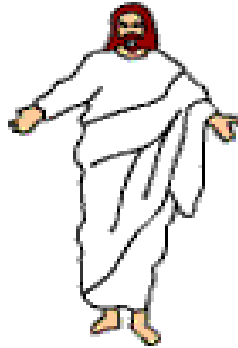

Heart Attack, Stroke and Cardiac Arrest Warning Signs

Act in Time

The American Heart Association and the National Heart, Lung, and Blood Institute have launched a new "Act in Time" campaign to increase people's awareness of heart attack and the importance of calling 9-1-1 immediately at the onset of heart attack symptoms.



Dial 9-1-1 Fast

Heart attack and stroke are life-and-death emergencies — every second counts. If you see or have any of the listed symptoms, immediately call 9-1-1. Not all these signs occur in every heart attack or stroke. Sometimes they go away and return. If some occur, get help fast! Today heart attack and stroke victims can benefit from new medications and treatments unavailable to patients in years past. For example, clot-busting drugs can stop some heart attacks and strokes in progress, reducing disability and saving lives. But to be effective, these drugs must be given relatively quickly after heart attack or

stroke symptoms first appear. So again, don't delay — get help right away!

Statistics

Coronary heart disease is the No. 1 cause of death in the United States. Stroke is the No. 3 cause of death in the United States and a leading cause of serious disability. That's why it's so important to reduce your risk factors, know the warning signs, and know how to respond quickly and properly if warning signs occur.



Heart Attack Warning Signs

Some heart attacks are sudden and intense — the "movie heart attack," where no one doubts what's happening. But most heart attacks start slowly, with mild pain or discomfort. Often people affected aren't sure what's wrong and wait too long before getting help. Here are signs that can mean a heart attack is happening:

- **Chest discomfort.** Most heart attacks involve discomfort in the center of the chest that lasts more than a few minutes, or that goes away and comes back. It can feel like uncomfortable pressure, squeezing, fullness or pain.
- **Discomfort in other areas of the upper body.** Symptoms can include pain or discomfort in one or both arms, the back, neck, jaw or stomach.
- **Shortness of breath** with or without chest discomfort.
- **Other signs** may include breaking out in a cold sweat, nausea or lightheadedness

As with men, women's most common heart attack symptom is chest pain or discomfort. But women are somewhat more likely than men to experience some of the other common symptoms, particularly shortness of breath, nausea/vomiting, and back or jaw pain.

Learn the signs, but remember this: Even if you're not sure it's a heart attack, have it checked out (tell a doctor about your symptoms). Minutes matter! Fast action can save lives — maybe your own. Don't wait more than five minutes to call **9-1-1**.

Calling **9-1-1** is almost always the fastest way to get lifesaving treatment. Emergency medical services (EMS) staff can begin treatment when they arrive — up to an hour sooner than if someone gets to the hospital by car. EMS staff are also trained to revive someone whose heart has stopped. Patients with chest pain who arrive by ambulance usually receive faster treatment at the hospital, too. It is best to call EMS for rapid transport to the emergency room.

If you can't access the emergency medical services (EMS), have someone drive you to the hospital right away. If you're the one having symptoms, don't drive yourself, unless you have absolutely no other option.

Stroke Warning Signs

The American Stroke Association says these are the warning signs of stroke:

- Sudden numbness or weakness of the face, arm or leg, especially on one side of the body
- Sudden confusion, trouble speaking or understanding
- Sudden trouble seeing in one or both eyes
- Sudden trouble walking, dizziness, loss of balance or coordination
- Sudden, severe headache with no known cause



If you or someone with you has one or more of these signs, don't delay! Immediately call 9-1-1 or the emergency medical services (EMS) number so an ambulance (ideally with advanced life support) can be sent for you. Also, check the time so you'll know when the first symptoms appeared. It's very important to take immediate action. If given within three hours of the start of symptoms, a clot-busting drug called tissue plasminogen activator (tPA) can reduce long-term disability for the most common type of stroke. tPA is the only FDA-approved medication for the treatment of stroke within three hours of stroke symptom onset.

Cardiac arrest strikes immediately and without warning. Here are the signs:

- Sudden loss of responsiveness (no response to tapping on shoulders).
- No normal breathing (the victim does not take a normal breath when you tilt the head up and check for at least five seconds).

If these signs of cardiac arrest are present, tell someone to call 9-1-1 and get an AED (if one is available) and *you begin CPR immediately.*

If you are alone with an adult who has these signs of cardiac arrest, call 9-1-1 and get an AED (if one is available) before you begin CPR.

Use an AED as soon as it arrives.

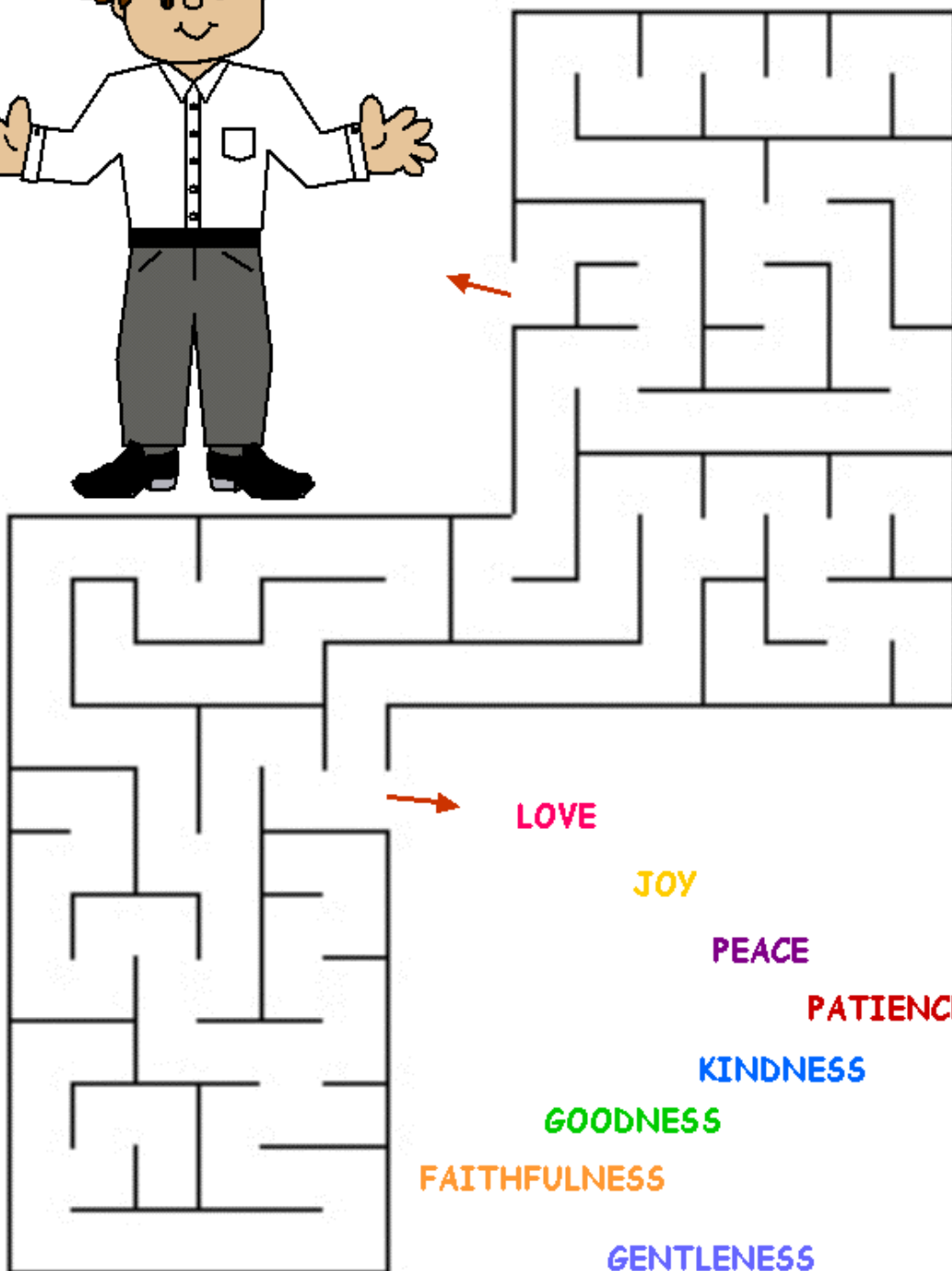
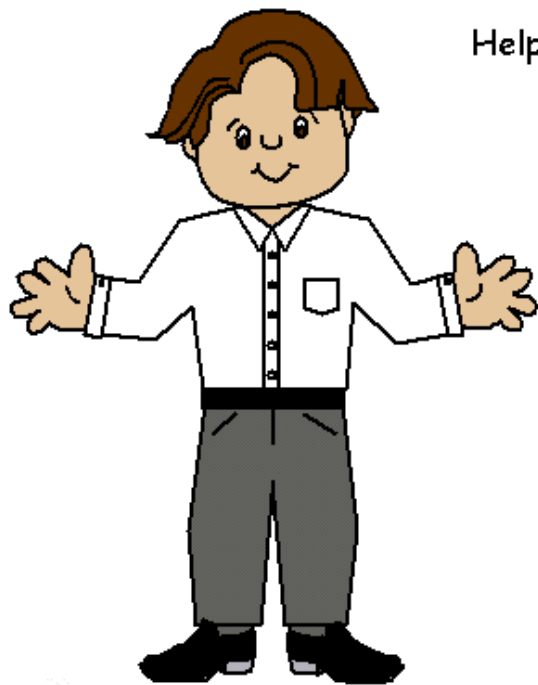
